## Assignment Policies

- It is the student's responsibility to make up any work missed. The student must ask for the work missed!
- The student has three days to make-up the assignment.
- Only Excused absences apply.

Name (First and Last)

Date

Period #

**Title** of Assignment including the number of the Chapter for which the assignment is for.

#### Test

- Tests will be given periodically. Students will note when they have an upcoming test.
- Test may include multiple choices, matching, fill in the blanks, DBQ (document-based questions), short answers or essay questions.
- Types of evaluations include:
- Quizzes (worth 1 grade- in between the chapters)
- Chapter tests (worth 2 grades- at the end of the chapter)
- Unit tests/ EOC Practice Test (worth 2 grades)
  Civics EOC (End of Course Exam)
- 30% of the student's final course grade.
- You will have baseline testing, quarterly interims, and Midyear Assessment.
